



PRESIDENTS REPORT

Garry Bell
Hon. President



While the majority of the 2019/2020 season has been yet again another outstanding success for Coolangatta with no lives lost on our beach, an increase in active patrolling members and generally prosperous times thanks to our ever-giving volunteers and dedicated Supporters Club, it was also an end to a season like no other. From mid-March 2020 the Coronavirus COVID-19 global pandemic impacted our daily lives and due to the governments required social distancing laws, the club was forced to be completely closed to our members. Coolangatta beach was totally closed and barricaded off, patrols were reduced to surveillance only, club social and sports events were affected with cancellations or postponements from our in-house club Annual Dinner and Bronzies Day to State and national Aussie Titles. While it is an event never-before seen in the history of the club, planning is already in underway for a return to club operations. Although circumstances are still unfolding and the full impact of the Coronavirus is yet unclear the health and wellbeing of our members is the first & foremost priority for Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club.

Despite beach closures near season end the visitor numbers increased this season to 48,934 and our 13 teams of patrolling members still contributed an impressive 5,994 hours on our beach over the summer period for 2019/2020.

With 34 rescues, performed 52 preventative actions, 150 First Aid Treatments including 139 people treated for Marine Stings and warned 2078 people about possible dangers that could have easily ended up becoming a rescue.

Total membership was slightly up this year with 385 overall members; together with an increase in active patrolling members. Nipper numbers were reduced this season to 74 Nippers together with slightly lower numbers for our 51 Associate members.

Coolangatta's Chief Training Officer Belinda Doman with assistance from Alistair McCooke together with invaluable support from members Janeen Nowlan, Lachie Taylor, Kylie Starling, John Fraser and Tom Alexander has again achieved some fantastic results for us with 39 Bronze Medallions, 14 SSV, 20 First Aid, 4 ART, 27 Radio, 19 CPR, 3 Beach Management, 13 Tractor, 10 SRC, 3 IRBC and 4 IRBD awards completed. Our thanks to all the trainers and assessors who contributed their time to training, assessments and proficiencies throughout the season.

Although the 2019/2020 Annual Awards has been postponed this season to a later date the award winner nominations and winners were determined on-line.

Our Supporters Club has continued to thrive in 2019/2020 and the excitement of looming record profits was slightly tempered by the early ending of the season due to COVID-19 restrictions. In a first for the club Coolangatta Supporters Club Manager has been awarded the Best New Member. Steve Edgar received his Bronze Medallion this season and has given an immense amount of time and support to the club and surf life saving. Steve has been committed to patrols, fundraising and demonstrating an all-inclusive and cohesive effort to the club. Our thanks to Steve for all his efforts and his dynamic team of Supporters Club staff who we strongly believe will return next year with a new zest for further success.

Throughout the season my involvement with so many dedicated volunteers working to bring the best to Coolangatta gives me great pride in the club and its members. Finally thank you to all of my colleagues Margaret Cargnoni, Damian Ling, Craig Maidment and Dion Ezzy on the Executive Committee and the Management Committees members Belinda Doman, Danny Hoyland, Steve Ward, Stu Marshal, Tony Maguire, Tracy Maidment and Janeen Nowlan for all the hard work and hours put in ensuring that our Club is being managed in the best possible way. Thank you to Di Lewis our Office Administrator for all her help and assistance, I am sure that every Coolangatta member would agree that Di is forever helpful, polite and professional in her job. Thank you also to our Point Danger Branch officers and staff, to Kerrie Barnes and Ken Hunter for all your assistance throughout the year.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The 2019/2020 season has certainly produced an interesting 12 months that I expect no one could have fully forecast. The club started off in a really good position with cash in the bank totalling \$112,601.

As we are all aware, the spread of COVID-19 has had wide ranging impacts on how business and organisations operate and has meant that boards have needed to be reactive to government directives and changing the changing landscape of what we do and how we do it. It is safe to say that the virus brought about a huge amount of uncertainty we were quick to acknowledge that there would be challenges faced because of its effects.

Again I highlight that importantly, a number of lessons were learnt from the adverse impact of the Commonwealth Games and through the hard work of both the Supporters Club and SLSC committees we saw additional repayments made into the loan account of \$151,567.89 (\$40,000 from SLSC cash reserves) reducing the total interest payable and providing a buffer in case of conditions that fall out of our control.

Broader lock-downs in Queensland along with the rest of the country sealed the fate of the Supporters Club operations and essentially saw the SLSC with no regular income; a precarious position that was daunting but ready to be taken on by both clubs. Both committees were committed to see the continued success of our great club and see us get through the immediate challenge with meetings swiftly arranged with both committees, auditors, the bank and a lot of regular updates from external sources in a continuously evolving environment.

Government support saw the CBA defer our loan repayments for 6 months through to September 2020 and it also saw us seek reimbursables for administration staff wages through the Job Keeper program and Cash Flow Boost payments totalling \$10,000 offsetting our ATO payables and supplementing our cash reserves for an additional period of time.

With loan repayments re-commencing in September 2020, we expect that the initial fiscal response from the club will be to attempt to maintain operational cash reserves for the Supporters Club whilst recommencing regular loan payments noting the reduced capacity under current health directives. We expect that we will see a reduced contribution return as trading conditions continue to improve over time similar to how we responded to the Commonwealth Games trading conditions and then a return to full contributions and additional payments to the loan once we have returned to full capacity at a unspecified point in time.

As everyone can sympathise, there is a long road ahead but we are well placed to ensure the continuity of the club operations and it again highlights that fundraising, sponsorships, donations and grants will be critically important for the next 12 months as we return to a more familiar funding structure.

Last year we invested in Donation Point Tap and Go donation terminals, these are now coming back online as a passive tool and we will be looking at approaching local businesses to gather their interest in hosting one of these terminals. We also saw the implementation of a combined photocopier service agreement covering both clubs which delivered huge savings to both clubs and improved equipment for administration in both areas.

Summer Surf Ambassador is a great avenue for the club to raise funds and whilst we haven't made it to the finish line in the past two seasons, we have raised an average of circa \$21,000 in each of the two years. This is a worthwhile endeavour with approximately \$40,000 raised per year per participant and the 2019 highest fundraiser returning \$83,205 back to her local surf lifesaving club.

Key figures from the financial report include:

- Income down 10% to \$1,008,643
- Grant income varies and fell as expected
- Sponsorship was down but has had a solid start to the current financial year
- BBQ Income, Raffle Income and Supporters Distributions are down based on restrictions to events and trade
- Expenditure saw a less than 1% increase from last year to \$855,713 which is a fantastic result noting that most of our operating costs are fixed in nature.
- This resulted in an operating surplus of \$152,930 with a strong cash (early entry into COVID conditions) position of \$97,749.

I would like to thank both committee for their continued support throughout the season and especially in the past months since the impact of COVID-19. It truly has been a massive team effort with many late night, phone calls, emails, and virtual meetings to ensure that we are in a strong position going forward.

Congratulations to everyone for a great 2019/2020 season at the Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club. What a great season it has been one to go in the history books. We can celebrate another year with no lives lost, thanks to 178 patrolling members in 13 great groups completing over 6043 patrol hours to keep the public safe.

The season started off like any other, until COVID-19 came to town. This resulted in our patrols being reduced to surveillance patrols, followed by the closer of our club house. Then to top it off the Gold Coast Mayor - Tom Tate decided to close Coolangatta Beach completely preventing anyone from getting onto the sand, but we were advised that we still had to remain on surveillance patrols to fulfil our service agreement over this time despite all beach access points being closed. This had never been done before and there was no written procedure for how to manage this. Thanks to the help of SLSQ and Point Danger Branch, we all came together to work through this challenging time. A big thanks must go to all of our Patrol Captains for your leadership and to our patrolling members for coming together over this time and showing what a great team we all are.

Despite a testing season we have continued to show team work and dedication as we protected 48,934 visitors, recorded 34 rescues, completed 2078 preventative actions and assisted with 11 First Aid treatments and 139 marine stings.

To all our patrolling members thank you for your hard work and your efforts.



IRB REPORT








DIRECTOR OF SURF SPORT REPORT

It has been my absolute privilege to oversee surf sports and competitors this season. While it came to be a briefer season than anyone expected, there was no shortage of exceptional results. Activities were not limited to the sand and water, with numerous activities occurring behind the scenes to help provide our competitors reach their goals and achieve results worthy of their hard work.

The season began off the back of multiple long-distance paddles ranging between 14km and 18km, with the club proudly represented by myself, Gary Gee and Elizabeth Rudland. Elizabeth finished the QLD ocean paddle series first overall, after two 2nd placings and a 1st placing, while myself and Gary placed in the top 5 and 10 respectively.

The first official carnival of the season was held at Burleigh Heads MP SLSC, the State Endurance Carnival was attended by 11 of our best competitors who contended with substantial wind chop, water so full of cornflake weed that it was more cornflake than water and a freak storm in the afternoon which resulted in the ski races being cancelled minutes prior to their completion. Regardless, Coolangatta claimed the overall handicap point score, a testament to the effort our competitors put in to training and racing. Nick Fawaz took out the 4km beach run. Tracey took out the her 4km beach run, 2km board paddle and placed third in her 2km surf race. Caroline and Amadeus Bellenger placed 2nd and 3rd respectively in their 4km beach runs. Kylie Starling placed 2nd in her 2km swim. Billy Ryan placed first in his 2km beach run and board paddle. Brian Smith placed 5th in his 1km swim, and 3rd in his 2km board. Alistair McCooke placed 4th in his 1km surf swim and 2km board race. Susie Harker placed 3rd in her 1km surf race. Elizabeth Rudland placed 8th in the open 2km surf race, and got off the beach with a flying start in the Ski before lightning inevitably ended the race. I was holding 2nd place in the 6km ski race, again the lightning inevitably ended the race.



Congratulations to all competitors who took part in the Coolangatta gold. Some great results were achieved and a lot of fun was had! Elizabeth Rudland had an unbelievable race to finish 4th in the open woman's short course race, only seconds from bronze. Alistair McCooke also raced in the masters division and finished well inspiring us all. The Gatta girls and guy's, Caroline Bellenger, Susie Harker, Amadeus Bellenger and Chez Suska finished a commendable 4th and the Bearded Clams got a silver in the long course today with the team consisting of myself, Nick Jones, Nick Fawaz and Gary Gee. This event requires a tremendous amount of time and effort put into preparation and all competitors who have a go should be commended regardless of their results.

Elizabeth Rudland and Gary Gee represented the club at a multitude of local carnivals including Oceans 38 R1 at Tugun SLSC, Summer of Surf Round 1 and 2 at BHMP SLSC and Mermaid Beach SLSC and the Australia Day Murphy Homes Carnival held on the Sunshine Coast. Semi-finals were achieved, as were quite substantial wipe-outs in some trying surf.

Elizabeth Rudland competed at both PDB and QLD Surf Rescue Championships, placing 1st and 3rd respectively in the open women's Champion Lifesaver event. She also qualified for the Australian titles as a result. This event runs over multiple days and tests theoretical knowledge, resuscitation skills and physical skills in the surf.

The branch titles held at Tweed Heads and Coolangatta SLSC showcased the talent in our pool of competitors, with Coolangatta placing 5th overall and receiving 14 medals with only 12 competitors. Being so close to home offered plenty of benefits, we all appreciated not driving our craft around and searching for carparking as well as the 'home beach advantage'. Special mention to Tracey McCooke and Daryl Harding for racing at their first branch championships, the first of many and with grace and grit of seasoned competitors! Caroline Bellenger ran very well in a tight field of master's women. Gary Gee and Nick Jones took out the 30 to 45 years board race in 1 and 2, a very impressive performance. Alistair McCooke proved himself a fierce double ski competitor, also racing in ski and swim with excellent results. I greatly appreciated having a doubles partner

with such an awesome attitude to racing! Phil Wyper placed 2nd in the 45+ flags. Vincent Loubet showed himself in good stead for state and Aussies, bringing one board relay home on what may have been the only wave of the day. Lastly, our smallest and probably our most tenacious little competitor, Elizabeth Rudland held her own in a crack field of Nutri grain ironwoman finishing one wave behind the leaders in the board and ski, and also had a great swim.

The Brunswick Masters Carnival capped the season off, again the team represented the club admirably, and managed to come home 2nd overall. The incredibly challenging surf created conditions not dissimilar to Aussies of past. The board squad's hard work over the season showed, with Gary, Nick J and Vincent all taking out their age groups. Gary should also be mentioned for his hard work and commitment to the competition, regardless of injury. Nick's work in the lead up to State and Aussies showed, as he was snapping at Gary's heels. Vince showed his work at V-Squad had paid off, performing well. Tracey and Alistair were the king and queen of the sand, both winning their flags, sprints and 2km races. I myself, stayed upright and established myself as the 50-60 year age ski champion. Finally, once again we get to Lizzie, who unofficially raced alongside Tracey in the women's events. Efforts put in throughout the day showed that she was held in good stead to represent the club with some positive results in the elite open woman's field.



Aside from the interclub competitions, the Club Championships were held on 21st of December. This morning was a roaring success, with lots of members from all areas of the club attending. It's not very often you see a boaty paddling a board! We were very much looking forward to hosting a second round. Congratulations to our open club champions, Gary Gee and Elizabeth Rudland, and our Masters champions, Nicholas Fawaz and Caroline Bellenger.

Behind the scenes, a massive overhaul of club equipment and competitor uniforms occurred this season. Competitor packs were distributed prior to Branch, which meant our team was dressed to impress. A brand new Brave double ski was acquired, as were 4 new Kracka competition boards. A clean out of the board and ski area early in the season created some much-needed room in order for the board and ski sheds to be used functionally. Continued re-vamping of the space and upgrading of club equipment will ensure that the facilitation of training and competition will continue at a level conducive to achieving the long-term goals of the surf sports section.





The Magpies were the Australian Open Champions and done our club proud.




CHIEF TRAINING OFFICER REPORT

The 2019/20 season has been a season like no other and will certainly be one to go down in the history books. It is fantastic to see so many members keen to develop their skills with 172 new patrolling awards being completed, but unfortunately a few courses had to be cancelled or postponed due to COVID-19. Firstly, I want to say a big congratulations to all members that have achieved new awards this season and I really hope that this enthusiasm can continue into next season.

We trained a total of 38 new Bronzies as well as 10 new SRC's and 6 Observers, conducting 4 bronze/ SRC squads this season. We completed 2 x one-week intensive programs and 1 x eight-week programs training every Saturday morning as well as a special course for the students and staff of St Joseph's College. St Joseph's College are looking forward to continuing this relationship next season and bringing another group back to complete their awards with us. A massive thanks must go to Alistair McCooke for all the time he put into coordinating and training this group.

This season we only completed 1 IRB course, training 3 new crewies and 4 new drivers. Unfortunately, our second course for the season was cut short due to COVID-19 restrictions coming into place, but we will reschedule courses in the new season to get this award completed. We also conducted a couple of vehicle awards with 13 members completing the Tractor induction and 20 members completing the SSV induction this season.

We completed 43 Emergency Care awards during 2019/20. We are lucky to be able to conduct these courses in-house at the club so that our members don't have to rely on Branch courses. The First Aid course form part of every Bronze course that we conduct so our members are going onto patrol with these higher qualifications from the onset. Unfortunately, we are no longer allowed to conduct Advanced Resuscitation Techniques courses as part of Bronze training which resulted in a significant decrease in the number of members completing the ART course this season. This season we saw 20 members complete or update their First Aid Certificate, 4 complete the Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Certificate and 19 complete a Resuscitation Certificate. We also had 3 members complete the Silver Medallion Beach Management course.

Our Bronzies day tradition also had to postponed due to COVID-19, but we still plan to hold this special celebration at the start of the 2020/21 season to recognise our new Bronzies and remember those we have lost.

A massive thanks to everyone that has assisted with training especially Alistair "Cookie" McCook and Phillip "Hammo" Hammond who were always there when I needed a hand. To Damian Ling and Dion Ezzy for your ongoing dedication to IRB training. Thanks also to Garry Bell for jumping in and leading a hand whenever your busy schedule allowed it. To our coach Daniel Homer for assisting in teaching board skills to our new Bronze and SRC candidates, thanks for your time and expertise in this area. To the large number of the members that helped with water safety, swimming with the bronze trainees or keeping an eye on my girls while I trained squads I can't thank you enough because without your support we certainly couldn't have achieved the great result we have this season. You know who you are because there are far too many of you to name. It has been a massive team effort so THANK YOU to all involved!

Proficiencies or Skills Maintenance seemed to run well again this season running 4 proficiency dates. The first proficiency in September was a big one with the remaining 3 dates having an even spread of numbers. A big thanks to Garry, Hammo, Dion, Damian, Ross Browning and Cookie for their assistance in making this such a smooth and efficient process for our members.


I would like to thank the management committee for their ongoing support, I have really enjoyed the opportunity to work with all of you. To Kerrie Barnes and the PDB staff and Rachael Clark and all the SLSQ staff thanks for your assistance. It is great to know I have so much support! There is no doubt that 2020/21 season is going to be a challenging season as we navigate a new normal but as always, the focus will remain on retaining and upskilling our existing members and recruiting new members. If you know anyone that would like to do their Bronze, make sure you tell them to come to Cooly. If you want to do any awards, please make sure you let us know and we can register your interest. SLSQ will now be able to offer Trainer, Assessor and Cert IV courses online to our members. I would strongly encourage you to consider doing these courses if you would like to assist with training, we really do need more support and you will find that training and sharing your skills and knowledge with others is one of the most rewarding things that you can do. I am looking forward to seeing you on the beach and celebrating the successes of the 2019/20 season as soon as we can!

1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (QLD)*. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

(a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(b) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amount of all PPE is depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs to sell and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

(d) Employee Provisions

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee provisions have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

(e) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts.

(f) Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and other receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(g) Revenue and other income

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Fundraising, sponsorship, and donation income is recognised when the association takes control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

Grants with conditions attached which must be satisfied before the contributions will be received will be recognised as revenue only when those conditions have been satisfied.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

(h) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(i) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

(j) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(k) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

(l) Economic dependence

As at 30 April 2020, current liabilities exceed current assets by \$202,453 (2019: \$219,671). The Association receives donations each year from Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Supporters Club. The Association is dependent on the continuation of these donations in order to maintain operations at the current level. As at reporting date, the Committee is of the opinion that these donations will continue in the foreseeable future.

(m) Estimation uncertainty

Information about estimates and assumptions that have the most significant effect on recognition and measurement of assets, liabilities, income and expenses is provided below. Actual results may be substantially different.

Useful lives of depreciable assets

Management reviews its estimate of the useful lives of depreciable assets at each reporting date, based on the expected utility of the assets.

Inventories

Management estimates the net realisable values of inventories, taking into account the most reliable evidence available at each reporting date.



Opinion

We have audited the financial report of Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc, which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2020, the statement of profit or loss and other comprehensive income for the year ended, statement of changes in equity, statement of cash flows and notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the statement by members of the committee.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Club Inc as at 30 April 2020 and of its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements and the requirements of Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (QLD)*.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. The Association's current liabilities exceed its current assets by \$219,671 (2019:\$219,671) as at reporting date. The Association receives donations each year from the Coolangatta Surf Life Saving Supporters Club. The Association is dependent on the continuance of these donations to maintain operations at the current level. As at reporting date, the committee members are of the opinion that these donations will continue for the foreseeable future.

Emphasis of Matter – Basis of Accounting

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the association to meet the requirements of Division 60 of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* and the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (QLD)*. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

Responsibilities of the Committee for the Financial Report


